Kindergarten and First Grade

Dear Parents/Guardians,

It's hard to believe that it is already December, but I am so excited to share what we will be working on in the Kindergarten and First Grade room this month.

ELA

<u>Kindergarten</u> - This month we are going to work really hard on completely mastering our alphabet and reading CVC words. Additionally, we are also going to work on using sight words to read predictable texts. Please continue to read with your child at home as well as go over the sight words that I will send home every week. We are also going to be learning how to write sentences and how to leave a finger space between each word in a sentence.

<u>First Grade</u> - In December, our first grade students are going to start discussing the different aspects of a story such as characters, settings, and events and will be identifying the beginning, middle, and ending of stories. We will also be working very hard on a variety of grammatical skills such as creating past tense verbs and contractions. First grade students are going to use these newfound grammar skills to increase their writing and speaking ability. Additionally, we are going to start taking weekly spelling tests that include several sight words

Math

<u>Kindergarten</u> - Although I have already introduced our Kindergarten students to the idea of adding, this month we will be diving into addition and subtraction. I am so excited to watch them master these skills. We will also be continuing to work on our number sense, one-to-one correspondence, and counting to 100. We have really been enjoying exercising while counting over the past several weeks.

<u>First Grade</u> - We will be finishing up our chapter on adding strategies and will be working on our subtraction strategies. Additionally, we will be beginning to work on place value, which I am very excited to teach! You will see your students begin to soar in their math skills during this next month.

Social Studies

I am so excited about our social studies unit during December! We are going to take the opportunity to travel the world with our friend "Globe Trot Scott" and learn about different holidays all around the world! Along with increasing our knowledge of the world and different cultures, we will also be able to work on a variety of literary skills. Over the next several weeks, we will be discussing animals! We will discuss what animals need



Hello Families,

Welcome to December in 5th grade. I want to thank all of you who were able to attend parent-teacher conferences last month, as well as those I had phone conferences with. It is important that we work together when it comes to the growth and achievement of your child. The more we can communicate and stay on the same page about their behavior and academics the better.

LAST Month: We worked hard on our math skills thus far and have finished our first math Chapter test. Look for your child's test to be coming home soon, We also made steps to improve on our writing and spelling skills by completing an "I AM Thankful for..." activity. We will continue to sharpen our minds and our writing abilities.

THIS Month: In Math we will enter the world of fractions and decimals and how they relate to one another. We will explore where they live on a number line and how to compare two decimals or fractions using (greater than or less than). In Social Studies we will continue exploring the native settlers of the United States and how they came to settle in the various parts of our country. At the completion of this unit, the students will be assigned a project to further their exploration of a tribe of their choice. More details are to come. As this is a shortened month with the holiday break, we will make sure to get in plenty of practice of skills needed for the NWEA. Testing will begin in January after the winter break. The testing dates for fifth grade are as follows- January 10th- Reading and January 21st- Math. More details about testing will come as well.

Classroom Management: If you have NOT joined CLASS DOJO, please do so. I often will send messages through dojo when needed regarding your child's behavior throughout the day or alert you to important school news like snow days, or bus delays, etc.. I have been choosing 2-3 students almost every day to get a "Happy Call" home. If I am not able to make a "Happy Call" I will let you know through dojo. "Happy Calls" are a positive reinforcement for good behavior in the classroom. Our goal is to receive a "Happy Call" instead of a "sad call" for misbehavior.
